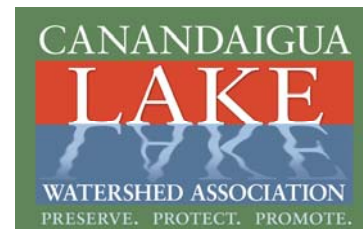
## Friday, April 8
