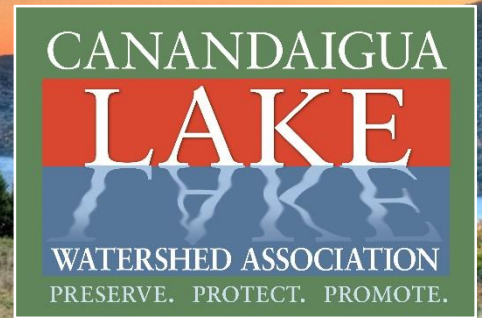


Join the Conversation: May 14th



Current Water Quality Status of Canandaigua Lake ... And What Residents can do to Reduce our Impact

Join Watershed Program Manager Kevin Olvany, and FLCC Professor of Conservation and Horticulture Dr. Bruce Gilman to learn more about the current state of Canandaigua Lake.

Dr. Gilman and Kevin Olvany will review the current water quality status of the Canandaigua Lake watershed along with looking at long term trend data from almost 20 years of water quality monitoring.

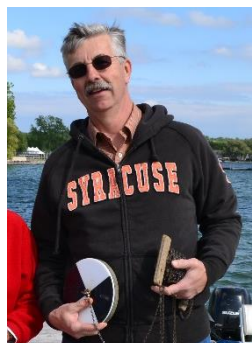
Bruce and Kevin will also look at potential threats to the health and overall environment of the lake, and will review what steps residents can take to reduce our impact on the lake.
